Keep Your Money Safe While Holiday Shopping

With the busy holiday season in full swing, we want to help you keep your hard-earned money safe from fraud. When doing your shopping online it's important to keep these five tips in mind before making a purchase.

Pay with your mobile wallet.

For greater security and convenience, add your credit or debit card to your mobile wallet account and pay easily with your device. Enjoy access to your cards through your mobile device with ease and peace of mind.

Shop on secure websites only.

There should be a padlock in the address bar next to the website url and it should have an "s" after "http." Click the padlock symbol and you should get a message telling you the connection is secure. If you get a warning, avoid the website.

Verify sellers before purchase.

If you see an item you want to buy but you don't know the seller, research them online to make sure they're legitimate. Find reviews on Amazon or type the name of the company plus the word "reviews" into a search field.

Use only secure networks.

If you're in a coffee shop or place that offers free Wi-Fi, don't use it for shopping. Public Wi-Fi is often unsecure, which means any information you send while connected to these networks can be accessed by fraudsters. Instead, use your own mobile data.

Pay attention to the returns policy.

If there is no returns policy, that's a red flag. And knowing what the policy is will help you if something isn't delivered or arrives broken, even if the seller wasn't trying to scam you.

Sometimes issues arise even when we've followed all security best practices. If that's the case for you and you're a Redwood Credit Union member, you have zero liability for fraudulent charges, which means if you didn't authorize it, you don't pay. 





How communities benefit when consumers shop local



deas about shopping are never set in stone, and the pandemic illustrated just how quickly consumer trends and opinions can change. Many individuals are now reevaluating how they spend their hard-earned money, particularly since inflation has affected just how far a dollar can be stretched. When consumers think about which stores to patronize, locally owned businesses may be the smartest option for a number of reasons — not the least of which is the way such enterprises benefit the communities they call home.

- More money kept in the community: Shopping locally means
 that more money will stay in the community. According to recent
 research from Civic Economics, local eateries return nearly 79
 percent of revenue to the community, compared to just over 30
 percent for chain restaurants. Overall, for every \$100 spent at a local
 business, around \$73 remains in the community, verus roughly \$43
 when shopping at a non-locally owned business.
- Get a personal touch: Local business owners typically are inclined
 to go the extra mile for their customers and are personally invested
 in the services and products they are selling. As a result, shopping
 locally tends to be a personalized experience. Furthermore, a
 local business owner may be more amenable to ordering products
 for specific clientele. Such personalized service is typically not
 accessible when shopping big box stores or other shops where
 owners are off-site.
- Support nonprofits: Local businesses often support good work in the community, such as nonprofit groups. These can include schools and sports teams, among other groups. According to Dr. Sue Lynn Sasser, professor of economics at the University of Central Oklahoma, studies indicate nonprofits "receive 250 percent more support from small businesses than larger ones."

A festive guide to caroling



hristmas caroling is a joyful tradition that has endured for centuries. Christmas caroling can be traced to the fourth century in Rome. Latin hymns were written to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. Historians believe that even before the emergence of Christianity midwinter songs existed to lift people's spirits through the bleak weather and extended hours of darkness.

- · Christmas caroling continues to unite communities and spread holiday cheer through song. It is time to inspire a resurgence of caroling by planning to gather friends, family, or neighbors for a caroling session. This guide can help anyone plan a memorable caroling event.
- Gather your group: Begin by assembling a group of singers. No one needs to be an expert singer, as enthusiasm goes a long way. Reach out to friends, family, coworkers, and/or local community members. Try to get a diverse group of people together whose main goal is to have fun.
- Find the right time and date: Typically evening hours after work or during weekends are when you can reach the greatest number of people. The goal is to enable participants to relax and enjoy the experience.
- Map out a caroling route: Carefully identify neighborhoods or locations that are known for being festive. While the organizer may choose to carol around his or her own neighborhood, it may be possible to engage more of the community in other

- settings. Look at local nursing homes or even community centers as caroling locations. Contact businesses along Main Street to see if caroling in the center of town to coincide with holiday shopping may be a good idea.
- Compile a list of classics: Most people will want to hear the carols and other songs they know and love. Make a list of classic Christmas songs that aren't overly complicated and singers will already know how to sing, such as "Jingle Bells," "Deck the Halls," "Frosty the Snowman," and "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer." If a particularly accomplished singer is in the group, he or she might do a featured solo. Be sure to have printed copies of the lyrics and sheet music for all participants.
- Enlist some musicians: Although caroling is traditionally done a capella, having someone who plays an instrument, like a guitar or violin, can ensure everyone is on the right note and can keep the pace of each song.
- Plan to rest: Singing can be joyful, but also tiring. Bring along refreshments so the carolers can rest their voices and stop to grab a drink or snack. Tea, coffee and cocoa can warm up participants on chilly days. Perhaps make one of the caroling stops in front of a local coffee shop and pop in after a set.
- Coordinate attire: Although everyone does not have to dress alike, a similar element, such as a red scarf or green mittens, can unite the group.

Simple In-Season Ingredients for Healthy Holiday Meals



hile many associate summer with an abundant harvest of fruits and vegetables, plenty of delicious ingredients are best enjoyed in the early weeks of winter.

- Using in-season ingredients in your holiday meals is a great
 way to ensure your food has the richest flavors and is full of
 nutrients. As a bonus, in-season produce is less expensive, so
 your expansive holiday menu won't break the bank! Here are
 six of the best in-season fruits and vegetables to include on
 your holiday table this year.
- Brussels Sprouts: Winter is a wonderful time to harvest brussels sprouts, so look for them in your local markets—in abundance!

hristmas trees are among the most recognizable symbols of the holiday season, and the popularity of trees is undeniable. There should be enough room around the tree for families and their guests to sit around it. The home interior experts at Better Homes & Gardens recommend leaving a minimum of six inches between the top of the tree and the ceiling. If a tree topper will be added, make sure the top of the tree is at least 12 inches from the ceiling. Measure the area before leaving to buy a tree so it can fit nicely into the room and the surrounding decor.
- Try the shake test. Anyone who has purchased a fresh-cut Christmas tree is undoubtedly familiar with the shake test.

- which remains an effective way to measure the dryness of the tree. A slight shake will produce some fallen needles. If the needles are brown and few and far between, then the tree likely is not overly dry. However, a lot of falling green needles indicates the tree is already drying out, which means it could shed quite a bit and lose its looks before Christmas Day.
- Pick a tree with a symmetrical look. Trees are living things, so
 it's unlikely that buyers will find a perfectly symmetrical tree.
 However, a tree that's misshapen or already has some sagging
 branches won't make for an awe-inspiring addition to a home
 decor scheme.
- Find the trunk (if you can). A trunk that's visible through the branches indicates the tree does not have dense branches, which will be necessary if homeowners want to dress the tree with ornaments. If it's hard to find the trunk because of all the thick branches and green needles, then the tree is likely pretty healthy.
- Test the needles. The home improvement experts at Lowes note that needles should be flexible but still snap when bent sharply. Avoid trees with needles that are already losing their color and can easily be pulled off.
- A Christmas tree garners a lot of attention come the holiday season, which only underscores the significance of finding a tree worthy of being the centerpiece of holiday decor.
